Do you like sushi? If so, how far would you be willing to go for free sushi? In Taiwan, hundreds of people had been willing to go so far as to change their names legally in order to take advantage of a special offer for a limited time by a Japanese restaurant chain.

It all started on March 15th when the Sushiro sushi chain announced on Facebook that it would be offering a special promotion—people with the Chinese characters for "gui-yu," which means "salmon" in Mandarin, on their identity cards would be eligible for a free all-you-can-eat feast, along with five of their friends. Those with Chinese characters on their identity cards that were not the exact characters for salmon but sounded the same as "gui-yu" would receive a 50% discount.
